

A Brief Life Sketch of Our Heavenly Patron, St. Fidelis (1577-1622)



Mark Rey, later known as St. Fidelis, was born on 1 October, 1577, in Sigmarringen, Germany, to John Rey and Anna Reuchlin.

Mark studied law and philosophy at the University of Freiburg, earning a doctorate in law. He worked as a lawyer and tutor to noble families.

In 1612, Mark joined the Capuchin Order, taking the name Fidelis, meaning "faithful" in Latin. He was drawn to the order's simplicity, poverty, and devotion to prayer and preaching. Fidelis was sent to Switzerland and he preached with great zeal and success. On 24 April, 1622, Fidelis was martyred by Protestant soldiers in Seewis, Switzerland. The exact circumstances of his death are still debated among historians.

St. Fidelis is Switzerland's patron saint, revered for his courage, devotion and commitment. He is often invoked as a patron saint for lawyers, judges, and politicians. He was a talented musician and played the violin. He was known for his exceptional preaching skills and his ability to connect with people from all walks of life. He was a strong advocate for the poor and the marginalized.

Fidelis was canonized as a saint in 1746. His feast day is celebrated on April 24.

ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

St. Fidelis school, KKK, Aligarh has zero tolerance for bullying, physical, mental, or in the cyberspace, obscenity, and any type of sexual offence by anyone in the school.

- All incidents of intimidation against another, especially against junior students, by forcibly taking their belongings, food, etc are bullying.

SHORT HISTORY AND GENERAL INFORMATION OF THE SCHOOL

St. Fidelis School, Kheda Khush Khabar, founded and administrated by the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Agra, is a private unaided, Catholic Minority Institution established in 2015 under Article 30(I) of the Indian Constitution.

With view of extending its Educational services to the people of Aligarh, second unit of St. Fidelis School was opened at Kheda Khush Khabar. The purpose of this school was to provide wholesome facilities to the students which will enable them to grow in holistic manner.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The school aims at imparting value-based education to the children of the citizens of Aligarh without any distinction of caste, creed, social status or gender; and enhance all round development of the students. To inculcate in them the values of true discipline, hard work, respect for all religions and cultures leading into national integration, human dignity, honesty and a spirit of sportsmanship to make them morally, socially, physically, and mentally fit to become active, useful and worthy citizens of India. Discipline with love is what we aim at inculcating in our students. That is precisely the motto of the school- "तमशो मा ज्योतिर्गमय" "From Darkness unto Light"

OUR CORE VALUES

- 1. God Experience: To help the students to realize the presence of God within themselves and in others.
- 2. Compassionate Love for all, Especially the poor and the Marginalized.

- 3. Communion, Collaboration, Team Spirit: To inculcate the spirit of teamwork and foster communion and collaboration in our institutions.
- 4. Excellence in Terms of Developing Each One's Unique Potentialities to Build a Just and Humane Community.
- 5. Truth, Love, Justice, and Peace: To respect and uphold the rights and dignity of every human being, to be loving, transparent, accountable, and just in our personal and institutional life and work diligently for peace.
- 6. Simplicity of Life Style and Dignity of Labor.
- 7. Respect for Life, Nature, Cultures, Religions and Love for the Nation.

RULES & REGULATIONS OF CBSE BOARD

The CBSE board is responsible for conducting two major board examinations in our country:

- I. The All India Secondary School Examination for Class 10
- II. The All India Senior School Certificate Examination for Class 12

The rules and regulations devised by the CBSE board to be followed by their schools are as under:

- 1. A student who attempts to take admission to a CBSE school can get admission only if she/he has been studying in a CBSE board- recognized or affiliated school or has passed an equivalent qualifying examination making him/her eligible for the same.
- 2. The Class IX examinations are conducted internally by the schools themselves. It's from class X onwards that the students appear for all the Examinations.

 The board formulates its own curriculum for the exams held throughout the year which specifies the number of papers, duration of the examination, and marks for each subject/paper etc.

ADMISSION RULES

- 1. The school is open for admission to both boys and girls irrespective of caste, creed or social status.
- 2. The right of admission is vested with the Management.
- 3. A child who has attained the age of 3 years in which the admission is sought, is eligible for admission to Nursery.
- 4. Admission to all higher classes will be governed by this rule.
- 5. A child who has previously studied in another recognized school will have to submit a Transfer Certificate from that school. Transfer Certificates from schools outside Aligarh must be countersigned by the Education Officer of the District concerned. Government-issued Birth Certificates will have to be submitted for admission of a child who has not attended any recognized school previously. Special attention must be paid to entering correctly the name and date of birth of the child. Subsequent changes will not be permitted.
- 6. Admission is finalized strictly on merit after screening/interaction/test, as per the decision of the principal, and after payment of the prescribed fees.
- 7. School fees are subject to revision at the discretion of the Management.
- 8. A pupil joining the school for the first time must produce satisfactory evidence of his/her date of birth from the Municipality or Gram Panchayat (form 5) and an Aadhaar Card.
- 9. Date of birth once registered cannot be altered. The date of birth entered in the admission register at the time of admission to Nursery will be considered as the final record and no change based on will be made under any circumstances.

EXAMINATION RULES

- 1. Three Semester Exams will be held in the whole Academic year to assess and observe each child on a particular syllabus.
- 2. Semester Examinations will be held in the month of July, November and March respectively in every Academic year.
- 3. There will be Class Tests and Assessment every month.
- 4. Students absent for an examination for any reason will not be conducted re-exams and those who absent themselves from an examination without grave reason will be considered fail.
- 5. In case of illness, a doctor's certificate will have to be produced. A Medical Certificate does not guarantee a promotion.
- 6. No candidate will be allowed to appear in any of the examinations unless all school dues have been paid in full.
- 7. Promotion to a higher class depends upon
 - a. Regularity in attendance (80%).
 - b. Regularity and quality of day-to-day participation in the class.
 - c. Completion of note copy and projects assigned by the subject teachers.
 - d. Clear pass in all the subjects in all the exams.
- 8. Results declared at the end of the year are final in all cases and will not be re-considered.
- 9. A pupil failing twice in the same class will have to discontinue his/her studies in the school.
- 10. A progress report is shown to parents after each Semester. Parents are requested to sign the report and return it to the class teacher.

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEES

- 1. All the fees are to be paid strictly in advance before the 15th
- 2. of the fee-scheduled month. The fee may also be paid yearly, half-yearly and quarterly.
- 3. Fee must be paid even for those months during which students have been absent.
- 4. Parents are requested to keep the fee receipt issued to them and produce them as proof of payment if and whenever needed.
- 5. Fee should be paid by the 15th of April, July, October, and January.
- 6. All the school dues must be cleared before the beginning of every Semester examination, failing which the student will be stopped from giving the examination.
- 7. Fine will be charged for those who intentionally pay late.

SCHOOL DIARY

- This Almanac should be brought to school every day. Failure to produce it, will be penalized Rs. 100 per day.
- ➤ If this school almanac is lost or damaged, a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged for replacement.
- ➤ Parents should read/understand all the details given in this almanac to motivate/help your ward accordingly.
- Affix a passport-size photo in regular uniform on page 1 for St. Fidelis school Certificate.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. Pupils must be punctual at the beginning of the day, for all subject classes and activities.
- 2. For every absence, a written statement, signed by the Parent/Guardian is required on the day the pupil returns. If a student is absent for more than 5 days for reasons of ill health, a certificate from a doctor is required stating illness and fitness.
- 3. A student who arrives late will need to bring an explanatory note from the parent/guardian.
- 4. All explanatory notes for absence/late arrival should be handed over to the class teacher.
- 5. Outside the vacation period pupils are not granted leave. Prior permission should be sought for absence from the school for any reason known or planned in advance.
- 6. The application for leave should be made on the page set for the purpose in the school diary.
- 7. Those children, who have been sent from the school or have been struck off the roll are as a rule not readmitted. If readmitted, they will have to pay the admission fee again.
- 8. All pupils must return after holidays on the re-opening day after every vacation.
 - Those who return late after the holidays will be fined Rs. 100/- per day of absence.
- 9. Students will not be allowed to leave school early unless parents/ guardians present a written note to the office & obtain permission from the Principal.
- 10. In case of infectious disease, the parents are required to submit a medical certificate to the effect that the child is fit to re-join.
- 11. Any unscheduled holidays may be made good by the school without prior intimation to teachers, parents & students.

12. Confirmation regarding any unscheduled holidays can be done by checking the school website, messages in the Group or the notice board at the gate.

CHEATING OR USING UNFAIR MEANS DURING THE EXAMINATION

- 1. Students found using unfair means in the examination shall be punished, depending upon the seriousness of the offence as mentioned below-
- 2. If a student is found to have actually copied from the answer book of another, his/her answer for that question shall be cancelled. Further, up to 10 marks shall be deducted from the marks obtained by him/ her on that paper. If in the opinion of the invigilator, a student is found helping another, he/she is also guilty and up to 10 marks shall be deducted from the marks obtained by him/her in that subject.
- 3. If any student is found possessing a written piece of paper or chit or a page torn out of a book or any other written matter on his/her hand, body or clothes, his/her examination paper shall be cancelled irrespective of whether he/she has actually copied from the material in his/her possession or not.
- 4. Any student misbehaving with the invigilator/Principal or threatening anyone, whether inside or outside the school campus shall immediately be expelled from the school.
- 5. The decision of the Principal in all such matters shall be final and binding on all concerned.

INFRASTRUCTURE

SCHOOL PROPERTY

- 1. Proper care must be taken of the school property and no pupil should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls, or in any way damage things belonging to others. Damages done even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or to the Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who does it. Anyone who sees something damaged should report the matter even if he/she does not know who has done it. No Pupils should bring razor blades or any sharp instruments to school.
- 2. Students shall cooperate with the library, computer, and laboratory staff, in maintaining order and discipline. Students shall take care not to cause damage or deface any of the materials, fixtures, and equipment that are provided.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

- 1. Silence is to be observed in the library. Books issued are to be properly looked after and returned on the due date.
- 2. All pupils of the school are members of the library.
- 3. Every student should read a minimum of 6 English books and Hindi books and the prescribed magazines. One-page

- summary of each book read must be shown to the language teachers. The name of the books read should be entered in the page given at the end of this diary.
- 4. A student may ordinarily borrow a book for a week, and may get it reissued for another week. No book that is in great demand shall be lent for more than four days.
- 5. Books will be issued to students during the library periods.
- 6. Reference books will not be issued. A member will be allowed to consult a reference book during school hours only.
- 7. The Librarian may call for a book at any time even if the normal period of loan has not expired.
- 8. If the date of issue/return of books happens to be a holiday, the issue/return of books shall stand postponed to the corresponding day of the following week.
- 9. If the book is not returned at the expiry of the period or after the librarian has called for it even within the period loan, a fine of Rs. 10/- per day will be charged.
- 10. Fines shall be collected by the librarian and the fact notified in the defaulter's card.
- 11. In case a book is misused, wrongly handled, damaged, or lost, the person concerned will have to pay the full price of the book.
- 12. Defacing books in any form and by any means is strictly forbidden. Fine shall be levied for violating this rule. Earmarking of a book is not allowed.

SCHOOL LABORATORY

- 1. Silence should be observed while doing practical in the laboratory.
- 2. The instructions given by the teacher must be followed.
- 3. Students will be responsible for any breakage, or loss of the apparatus which is used in the experiment. Even

- breakage or loss should immediately be reported to the teacher. In case of any breakage, a fine will be charged.
- 4. Students should bring to the laboratory proper record books and note down observations immediately after the experiments are performed.
- 5. Students will hand over the chemicals and apparatus taken for the experiment to the teacher when the experiment is over. They should not take out or bring any chemical/instruments to the laboratory.
- 6. Students should strictly adhere to safety rules and regulations while in the laboratory.
- 7. Students should use the computer for school activities only.
- 8. Students should not screw up with the computer system or setting. In case of any damage or inappropriate content, has to be informed to the teacher immediately.

WITHDRAWAL / DISMISSAL

- 1. One calendar months' notice will have to be given for the withdrawal of the child from the school. However, full fees for the quarter will be charged.
- 2. All dues must be cleared and books and other school property items returned before the child is withdrawn and the transfer certificate obtained.
- 3. Duplicate copies of T.C. may be issued on payment of Rs. 100/-, applications will be processed within a maximum period of 3 days and in case of counter signature 10 days with the self-addressed envelope.
- 4. The management reserves to itself the right to dismiss any student.
- 5. The Principal is empowered to effect the withdrawal of a pupil or to remove the name of the pupil from the rolls of the school if in his opinion the progress of the pupil or conduct is unsatisfactory or whose parents/guardians show little interest in the progress of their wards. Immorality, insubordination, contempt of authority or damage to property, irregularity in payment of school fees, using unfair means during the examination, stealing or cheating, use of Pan/Panparag, Cigarettes, etc are always enough reasons for immediate dismissal.
- 6. The management may require the withdrawal of any student when satisfied that such a step is necessary for the interest of the school.
- 7. A student involved in any incident ever outside the school brings discredit to the institution, either because of its unpleasant nature or inviting criminal or legal action by police or the court will be dismissed from school without enquiry.

MEETING (P.T.M.)

- 1. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to meet the teachers during class hours. Those wishing to visit the School or meet the staff of the School must first seek permission from the Principal.
- 2. Parents may meet the Principal any day from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. in winter, and 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. in summer except on Saturdays and public holidays. Interviews at any other time may be held by appointment. Teachers may be contacted before or after class hours.
- 3. Periodic meetings of parents with the teacher will be arranged by the principal in order to ensure coordination in the progress of the children's education.
- 4. Parents who regularly fail to attend Parent-Teacher meetings will be deemed to be not interested in the student's education. Such a student may be asked to discontinue.
- 5. It is compulsory to attend the parent-teacher meetings on the scheduled date. Kindly adhere to the timings.
- 6. Parents-Teacher meeting, the school diary must be brought along with them.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

- 1. Money should not be lent or borrowed or articles exchanged among the students.
- 2. GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- 1. It is vitally important that changes in residence/office addresses and telephone numbers are to be communicated in writing to the office immediately when they occur.
- 2. The school does not hold itself responsible for injuries sustained by pupil while in the school. However, first aid will be rendered immediately and injuries necessitating Hospital/OPD treatment attended to, without delay.
- 3. Pupils are advised not to have private tuitions. Parents are urged to encourage their children to do their daily work diligently and honestly and to pay utmost attention to the studies in the class room. If there is real need for help contact the Principal.
- 4. Parents are encouraged to have their children undergo medical examination regularly for general well-being, especially eye, ear and dental care.
- 5. Parents and/or pupils (individually or collectively) are forbidden to give gift to teachers. Neither parties nor gift presentations by students or parents on birthdays of students or such occasions are allowed. Token of flower or a sweet may be allowed.
- 6. Collection of funds for whatever use is forbidden without prior permission of the Principal. Students shall not sell or take orders for any merchandise in school or in the name of the school.
- 7. Pupils are required to behave politely and avoid using indecent language or actions injurious to the feelings of fellow students, teachers or others in this school. Any such behavior indicative of hurting others, caste or community will attract serious disciplinary action.
- 8. In the absence of the Teacher from the classroom, pupils

- are required to observe silence and obey the Monitor of the class.
- 9. Fines, which may be deemed necessary to be imposed on the students, are only to improve or to enforce discipline.
- 10. Pupils may be required to take part in various cocurricular and extra 20 curricular activities even outside School hours. When so required participation will be deemed compulsory.
- 11. Staying away from mandatory school functions, including Annual day and Sports Day, without prior permission or justification will be considered a discipline default.
